What an interesting year 2020 was and now we begin 2021. We choose to put behind us the things of last year and press forward with exciting things going on in our ministry, A Blessing To The Nations.

We're excited to say that we have completed the overall construction of our new church in Ghana, with only one last phase to be finished before we start having regular church services. We will be doing weekly Bible studies until we get the windows and doors completed for the grand opening. Pastor Frederick Yaro has been diligent in preparing the village to plan on joining our church when it is completed. There is no church in the village and recently a group of teenagers came and said when the church opens they will be there the first day.



The remaining phase is to complete doors and windows! Also adding a pulpit and we will buy 25 stacking chairs to start with a Weekly bible study until it's completed. Once this last phase is

We are excited to announce a fish farm investment to help us support the 50 widows who live on the mission grounds. They have been faithfully praying for the success of a Blessing to the Nations and all those connected to our ministry. Recently, newborn babies were left on our doorstep for us to raise and take care of. The gospel is free but being a viable ministry will deftly cost you time energy and money. We are also making plans now to plant gardens on the property to be able to help feed the 50 widows until our fish farm starts returning enough funds to be able to maintain the care of these widows.



This quarter we were proactive in helping pastor Joshua in Kenya with his tremendous problem of feeding the 50 widows in the mission house. This investment by B2N of \$1500.00 should return \$2,000.00 every 6 months.

PANAMA

Panama

Our AWANA (Bible memorization program) Is still producing tremendous results in the mission field. Betty and her sister Nina work tirelessly to teach these kids the word of God and they continually are in search of unreached villages where they can potentially start new AWANA programs. Panama was one of the first places where we started small cottage industries to supplement the income we were given by our pastors. We planted mango trees for Betty probably 10 years ago and they are really producing now. But Betty is a typical evangelist; she would rather give her mangos away in exchange for an opportunity for sharing the gospel than to try to sell them for a few pennies to supplement her income. Betty started a program called "Footsteps for Jesus" it is a program where they train the youth how to witness in the streets and prepare them to become pastors, evangelists, prophets, and teachers. They do a great job in the jungle environment building up these youth self esteem, to prepare them for better tomorrow. Presently we have four young girls are now in the University in Panama many of the boys have left the jungle and work in the police force or with the fire department. They now have a desire to start a Christian Academy at the present location which is not equipped to handle such a project. Her plan not only to care for these youth but to develop the basic skills, such as math, spelling, and teach them the word of God to equip them for their future life. Therefore our next big project is to help convert our mission house by purchasing some land next door to start this Christian Academy. One thing I've learned about being in the ministry is God's idea he will make sure that it comes to pass.
